## 04/01/15 To receive report of County Councillor

Cllr Tilley apologised for not attending more parish meetings but she now represented 19 parishes and struggled to attend every meeting. Reported that 2 OCC employees had been honoured in the New Years Honours list. The budget was very tight with savings still to be made and the grass cutting budget was very much down. The recycling tip was safe at the moment. Ouestions:

Cllr Gill said it was appreciated that after some time the pathway to the mill on the A417 had been cleared

Cllr.Williams Cuss asked about possible OCC funding for the pre-school possible extension. Cllr Tilley said that she would make enquiries but money was very tight and she no longer had access to a "pot of money"

Park lane was in a terrible state mostly due to Challow Bridge diversion, would it be resurfaced White line Horsecroft/High St in wrong place

Width of farm vehicles using Horsecroft - grass verges filling in ditches. Land owner had stated that when all animals etc are moved he would not need to use Horsecroft for access

Cllr Tilley stated that she would look into all the above. She stated that a leaflet "Safeguarding children" was being prepared regarding Child Protection , neglet and abuse and it would give guidelines into what should be looked for and who to report any suspicions to. ## 07/01/15 To receive report of Clerk

Broken fence post at football field replaced at reported cost of £125.

Overtime payments – after discussions with Chairman in which ways of reducing the workload had been discussed, Clerk had looked to work a flexi time system where the 15 hours per week would not fit a regular 3 hour day. If any overtime was necessary Clerk would bring it to Council for approval. Regarding Office allowance this item to next agenda

## 08/01/15 To receive report of Chairman

**Footpaths - Dogs/Livestock.** I met with Mr Ponting further to the discussion at our December meeting and his ongoing concerns for the welfare of his livestock due to dogs being walked along public footpaths and recent incidents which lead to a sheep being killed, and others injured. Since our last meeting, he felt that there had been an increase in the number of dogs being kept on a lead and was happier with the situation (you will recall that there was a note in the newsletter, and the PC supplied signs to remind dog walkers). I believe it would be beneficial to provide additional signs to other landowners with footpaths, within the parish, and will look to keep this included in the newsletter in the months ahead.

Affordable Housing. I have been put in touch with Stonewater, who will be the Affordable Housing Provider on the Nursery End estate. As they will be delivering this service for many years to come, I would hope that we can establish a good working relationship with them, which should in turn be beneficial to those in the parish seeking affordable housing. An initial meeting has been arranged for Tuesday 13 January — whilst I am now unable to attend, I have circulated the details and believe that Cllr's Gill & Warren will be able to meet with them instead.

**Sewage Issues.** Further to reports at our previous meeting, I have written to Thames Water's Chief Executive with details of the unacceptable number of incidents during the past 12 months, and subsequently provided information relating to the incident in Chapel Road on Boxing Day. Thames Water are proposing a meeting on Friday 16 Jan – time is to be confirmed and I will circulate the details once I have them.

Grass Cutting. Further to discussions at our last meeting, the Clerk received a letter just

before Christmas advising that unless we responded by 31 December, 2014 the OCC grant would be stopped and they would assume that we were not prepared to undertake the work. I spoke to the officer again, that day, and highlighted that historically we had maintained almost all grassed areas within the village and that therefore we were waiting for them to report back to us with regards the actual areas that OCC consider to be "theirs" before we were in a position to make a formal decision on this. This is still outstanding at this time, but I am assured that they are looking into what is available.

**\$106.** I have emailed VWHDC a couple of times over the last month, as it would be helpful to have an understanding as to what sums we might expect and when for the purposes of our budget planning. I have eventually spoken to one of the \$106 team today, who was unable to assist but was intending to follow this up with her colleague and come back to me.

**Internal Auditor.** Following a number of discussions, a parishioner has agreed to undertake the role of Internal Auditor. This is subject to approval from their employer, HMRC, so will need to go to next month's agenda.
